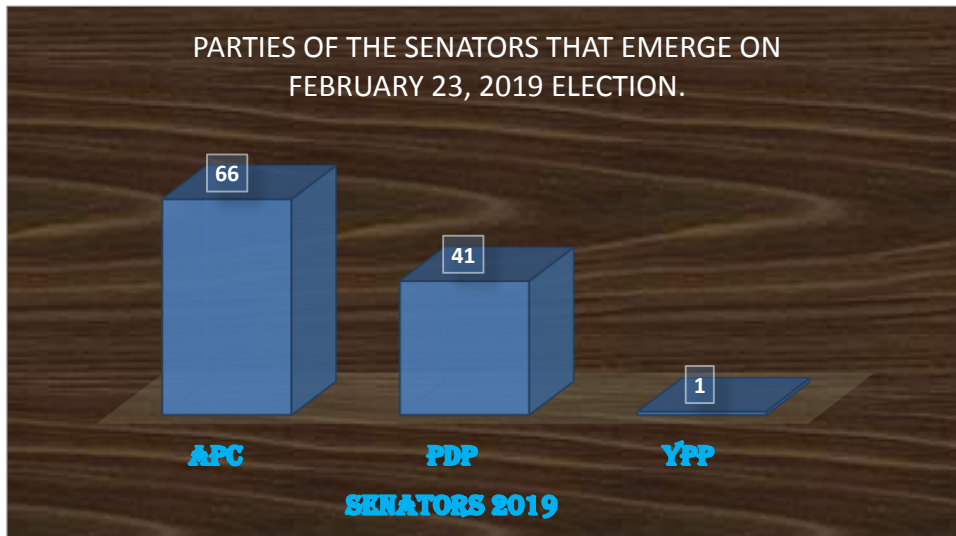
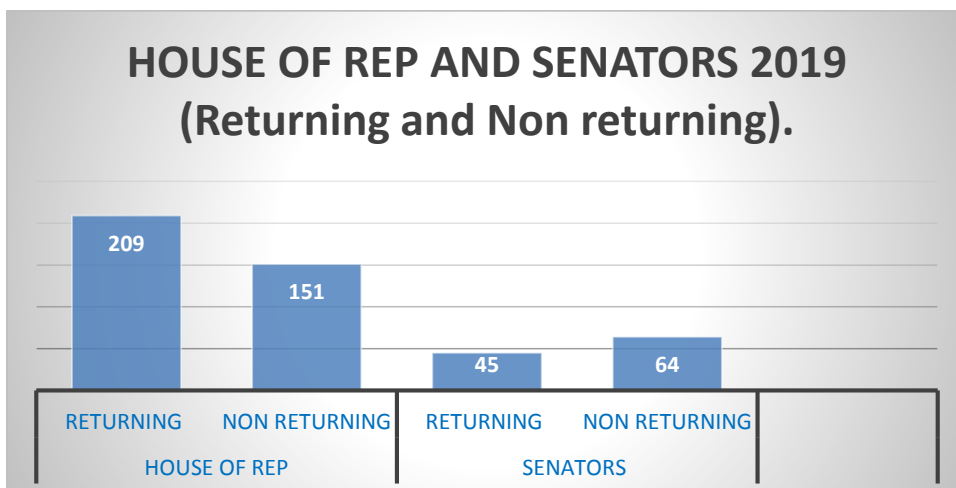


UNVEILING THE FACES THAT WILL SHAPE 9TH SENATE.

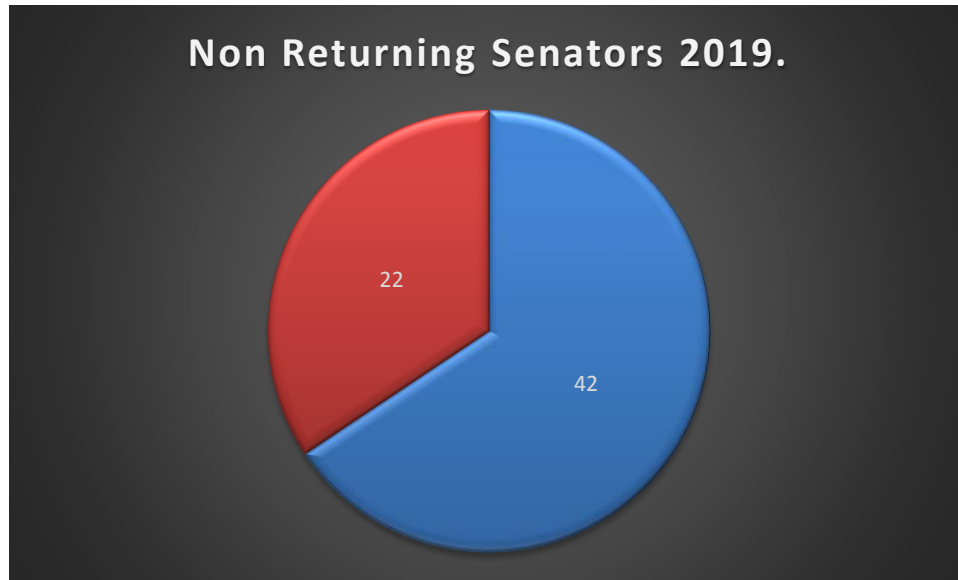
From the list released so far by the electoral body, the All Progressives Congress (APC) has 66 senators-elect, while the main opposition Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) has only 41 senators-elect. Another political party, the Young Progressives Party (YPP) has one senator-elect. Making it a total of 108 senators elected to the National Assembly. 15 of the newly elected senators are former state governors, it may be up to 16 if INEC eventually declares Governor Rochas Okorochoa of Imo State as senator-elect.



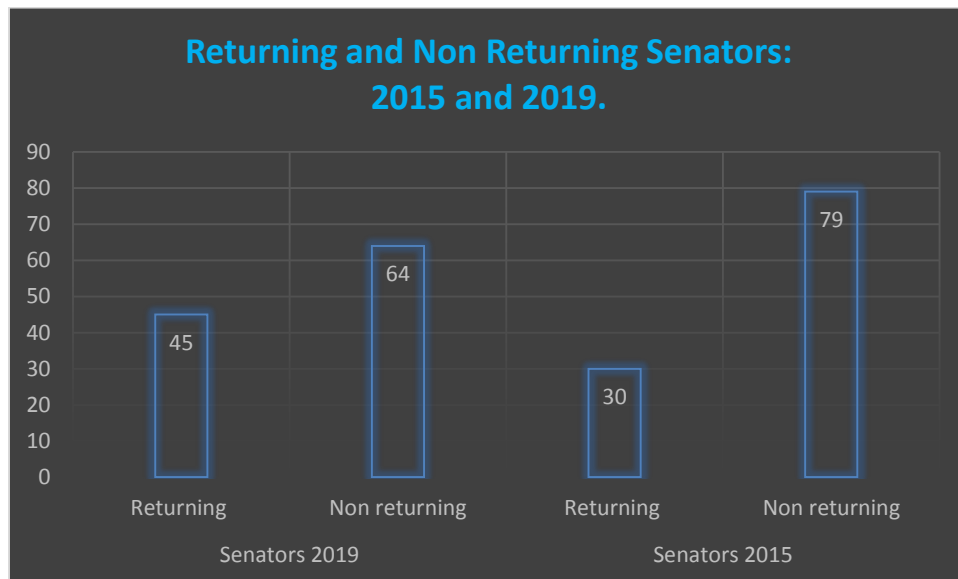
Results of the senatorial election of February 23, 2019 and subsequent re-run elections have shown that about 64 serving senators and 151 members of the House of Representatives will not be returning to the National Assembly on June 10 when the 9th Assembly will be inaugurated. Also according to the results of the elections released so far by the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), only 45 senators and about 209 members of House of Representatives will be returning to the National Assembly.



42 of the 64 non-returning senators could not get their party's' tickets in October last year at their respective primaries. The remaining 22 lost at the February 23 National Assembly election.



In 2015, 79 Senators couldn't return to the red chamber, only 30 returned, while results of the senatorial election of February 23, 2019 and subsequent re-run elections have shown that about 64 serving senators will not be returning to the National Assembly, only 45 senators will be returning to the National Assembly.
